Landslide Halts Traffic On Badrinath National Highway



Gopeshwar (Uttarakhand): A landslide occurred on Thursday near Nandprayag in Uttarakhand's Chamoli district bringing tonnes of rubble on the Badrinath National Highway and disrupting traffic.

The landslide happened during the widening of a road for the Chardham all-weather road project.

The rubble spread up to Nandprayag-Masur Road and also partially damaged some houses in the area creating panic among residents, the District Disaster Management Officer N K Joshi said.

However, there was no casualty, he said. The debris brought traffic on the route to a halt, the DDMO said. PTI

After Closure Of Iconic Lakshman Jhula, First-Of-Its-Kind Glass Floor Bridge To Replace It



Rishikesh: The Uttarakhand government has cleared the design of a glass floor suspension bridge, the first of its kind in the country, to be built across Ganga river in Rishikesh as an alternative to the iconic Lakshman Jhula which was closed last year.

Prepared by the Public Works Department (PWD), the design of the bridge is the first of its kind in India as it would have a floor made of toughened transparent glass giving pedestrians a sense of walking on the surface of the river while crossing through the bridge. Additional Chief Secretary Om Prakash said on Thursday.

The design has been approved and the department asked to prepare an estimate for the project, he said. The bridge will be built parallel to Lakshman Jhula with a total width of eight metres consisting of two toughened glass floors each with a width of 1.5 metres and as many 2.5-metre asphalt roads in between meant for light motor vehicles like two-wheelers, he said. The toughened glass floor will be 3.5 inches thick and capable of bearing a load of more than 750 kg per square metre at a stretch, the senior official said.

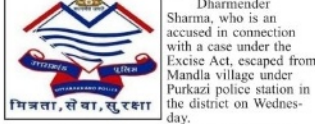

The Lakshman Jhula suspension bridge, which has been in place for 94 years, was closed in July last year due to safety reasons. Soon after its closure, Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat had announced that an alternate bridge will be built using modern technology. The design of the bridge is in line with the chief minister's announcement, the additional chief secretary said. PTI

Accused Escapes After Locals Attack U'khand Police Team In Muzaffarnagar

Muzaffarnagar: An accused fled after locals attacked an Uttarakhand police team that came to the village to arrest him in Uttar Pradesh's Muzaffarnagar district, police said.



Dharmender Sharma, who is an accused in connection with a case under the Excise Act, escaped from Mandla village under Purkazi police station in the district on Wednesday.

According to Purkazi SHO Pankej Tiagi, a police team from Uttarakhand had gone to the village to arrest the absconding accused. The villagers assaulted the police team when Dharmender was being taken into custody, he said. Meanwhile, local police registered a case against Dharmender along with four others Mohit Sharma, Budhu, Mange Ram and Pupu. Dharmender is wanted in a case in Uttarakhand's Deoprayag town for which the police team had come from the neighbouring state to arrest him, the SHO said. PTI

MACT Grants Rs 1 Crore Compensation To Kids Of Jewellers Killed Enroute To Kedarnath

New Delhi: A Motor Accident Claims Tribunal (MACT) has awarded Rs 1 crore compensation to the children of a jewellery businessman who was killed along with his wife in a road accident while going to Kedarnath on a pilgrimage.

The Motor Accident Claims Tribunal's presiding officer Vivek Kumar Gulia granted the relief to the children of Pampa and Dibyendu Samanta who were killed in 2011 near Dehradun, Uttarakhand, after an old tree uprooted and fell on their mini bus. The tribunal granted a compensation of Rs 61.18 lakh and Rs 39.96 lakh towards death of Pampa and Dibyendu, respectively. It directed the National Insurance Co. Limited, insurer of the of-

Kedarnath when due to heavy storm, a tree up-



rooted and fell on their bus resulting in the death of four people, including the Samantas.

The complaint alleged that the driver of the bus repeatedly ignored

passengers' requests to stop the bus in a safe place and continued driving. The tribunal noted that it was the responsibility of the driver to ensure the safety of passengers and he should have stopped the vehicle given the bad weather. "Even if it is considered that no occupant of the bus requested the driver not to drive in rough weather conditions, the driver, being in control of the vehicle and having the responsibility of safe driving, was required to stop the vehicle at some safe place and to wait for change in weather conditions and to continue the journey only when the driving condition became normal and safe," the tribunal noted. Eyesight Of An Old Man Restored After 30 Years At AIIMS

Uttarakhand. Prof. S.K. Mittal, Head of Department of Ophthalmology said, 73-year-old elderly resident of Haryana, Ranveer Singh, had no light in both the eyes. Because of this he could not see with any one of his eyes. After examination, it was found that if the cornea was transplanted in his right eye, his light could return.

Dr. Neeti Gupta, Medical Director of Rishikesh eye bank and a specialist in cornea transplantation, also agreed for the transplant, given the possibility of returning eye sight. The result was very successful after transplantation was done with extreme depth and high-tech technique, and now Ranveer Singh has started seeing the world. Dr. Neeti Gupta says that due to corneal opacity and cataract he was not able to see. The team took the risk and did corneal transplant with cataract surgery and implanted an intraocular lens in the same sitting and the team is also happy with the result. She said that some time ago, an 8-year-old girl from Haldwani, Sheetal had undervent a successful corneal transplant in her right eye. Both of her eyes were not able to see any thing since 2 years of age after corneal infection in both her eyes. After corneal transplant of her right eye she is now able to see. She also said that during the last 5 months in AIIMS, 62 people have successfully undergone cornea transplant

Pahalgam Receives Fresh Snowfall, Cloudy Sky In Kashmir

Srinagar: World famous health resort of Pahalgam and other upper reaches in the south Kashmir received fresh snowfall on Thursday afternoon. Drass in Union Territory (UT) Ladakh froze at minus 21.5 degree while Leh recorded minus 15.1 degree. Meanwhile, mercury witnessed dip due to cloudy sky in the Kashmir valley during the day after the minimum temperature was sub zero in most areas. A Met department spokesman said the weather will remain dry during the next 24 hours in the Kashmir valley. There will be no change during the subsequent two days, he said. However, a fresh Western Disturbance (WD) is approaching and could hit the region on February 11 which could result in isolated rain or snow. Fresh snowfall was received at famed health resort of Pahalgam this afternoon after cloudy sky during the day, a hotel owner told UNI over phone. He said the minimum temperature was minus 7.4 degree at Pahalgam, which serves as base camp for annual Anarnath pilgrimage in summer.

The holy cave shrine and its periphery also received fresh snowfall today. Reports of moderate to heavy snowfall was also received from Panjarni, Sheshnag, Mahagangas and Chandanwar, the last motorable halting station on traditional pilgrimage route.

However, at world famous ski resort of Gulmarg, about 55 km from here in north Kashmir, the sky was cloudy since this morning. The minimum temperature there was minus 9 degree. World class ski slopes are under three to six feet of snow, still awaiting skiers and adventure lovers. After witnessed yet another cold night due to minus 3.2 degree minimum temperature, sky was cloudy during the day in summer capital, Srinagar. However, sun was playing hide and seek for some time in the morning before going behind the clouds. Met spokesman said the sky would be mainly clear to partly cloudy and the maximum and minimum temperatures will be 8 degree and minus 3 degree respectively in Srinagar during the next 24 hours.
