

U'khand Govt Clears Proposals Worth Nearly Rs 300 Cr For Kumbh



Dehradun: Proposals worth nearly Rs 300 crore have been cleared by the Uttarakhand government for the 2021 Haridwar Kumbh, an official release said. The proposals include construction of a 150-bed hospital, a 1,000-bed COVID care centre, repair of a PWD guest

house at hill bypass road, water barricading and pitching tents in the Kumbh Mela area, it said. Besides these, the proposals for developing a Kumbh mobile app and putting in place a police surveillance system in the mela area have also been approved, the release said. The proposals were cleared at a meeting of the high-powered committee on Kumbh chaired by Chief Secretary Om Prakash, it said.

The chief secretary asked officials to speed up all works related to the upcoming event, saying the police surveillance system should be made operational using Information Technology Development Agency (ITDA) server by February next year. —PTI

Haryana To Exempt Electricity-Duty For 20 Years Under HEEP

Chandigarh (The Hawk): Haryana Deputy Chief Minister, Mr. Dushyant Chautala said that the State Government has decided to give exemption in electricity-duty for 20 years under 'Haryana Enterprises and Employment Policy -2020' (HEEP) to attract more industries in the state. Earlier this exemption was applicable only for 10 years, he added. Apart from this, those industries which will employ local youth will get a subsidy of Rs 48,000 per employee per year for seven years, he added.

He further said that special measures are being taken in the direction of providing benefits to investors by giving them 100 percent investment subsidy in lieu of State Goods and Services Tax. He said that the State Government has also planned to give special exemption in this policy to the industries for the management of residues of paddy straw and other crops so that along with being self-reliant in terms of electricity the country and state itself will be pollution-free. The draft of HEEP has been finalized and will soon be implemented in the state.

Mr. Dushyant Chautala, who also holds the portfolio of Industries & Commerce and Labour & Employment Departments said this while presiding over a meeting regarding 'Haryana Enterprises and Employment Policy -2020' with the concerned officers. Chief Principal Secretary to Chief Minister, Mr. D.S. Dhesi, Principal Secretary Industries and Commerce Department, Mr. AK Singh and Director, Industries & Commerce Department, Mr. Saket Kumar, Additional Director, Mr. Wazeer Singh, OSD, Deputy Chief Minister, Mr. Kamlesh Bhadoo, and other senior officers were also present during the meeting. Mr. Dushyant Chautala said that in the 'Haryana Enterprises and Employment Policy -2020' prepared by the Industries and Commerce Department, where on one hand suggestions have been taken from 151 industrial associations of the country, on the other, industrial policies of other states like Gujarat, Maharashtra, Andhra Pradesh, Uttar Pradesh, Telangana, Punjab, and Rajasthan were also studied to formulate the most apt policy for Haryana. The draft policy was uploaded into the public domain for about a month so that the stakeholders could study it and give their suggestions. (JMT-INF).

Protection Under New Land Laws In J-K In The Pattern Of Himachal, U'khand Laws: J&K Govt

Jammu: The Jammu and Kashmir government on Monday asserted that all safeguards and protection have been incorporated in the new land laws for the Union territory as have been enacted in Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand.

"The laws do not mention anything like domicile (needed to purchase non-agriculture land in J&K). The domicile is issued under a separate act and is meant for jobs. So here, anybody can buy the non-agriculture property, but only agriculturists can buy agriculture land," Financial Commissioner Pawan Kotwal said at a press conference here.

He was replying to a question on confusion among the public regarding buying of land in J&K by outsiders.

The Centre had recently paved the way for people from outside Jammu and Kashmir to buy land in the Union territory (UT) by amending several laws, over a year after the nullification of Articles 370 and 35A of the Constitution.

The government has repealed 11 land laws that existed in the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir, replacing the old, regressive, intrinsically contradictory and outdated laws with a set of modern, progressive and people friendly provisions, Kotwal said.

The new land laws will not only afford protection to over 90 per cent of the land in J&K from being alienated to outsiders, but will also help revamp the agriculture sector, foster rapid industrialisation, aid economic growth and create jobs in the UT.

Rohit Kansal, Principal Secretary (Information), who was also present in the press conference, noted that the old land laws were required to be modified for modern economic needs.

"Besides, they were

beset with ambiguities, contradictions and redundancies and in many cases, were clearly regressive," he said.



"For instance, the old Agrarian Reforms Act prohibited the selling of land distributed to tillers even after 44 years. The Right of Prior Purchase Act severely constrained an owner's right to dispose of his own property," he said.

Kansal said the new land laws are modern and progressive even while affording adequate protection against alienation of land to outsiders.

"A number of protections have been built into the new land laws on similar lines as has been enacted in other states such as Himachal Pradesh and Uttarakhand," he underlined.

The official said no agricultural land can be transferred to any person from outside J&K, but can only be sold to an agriculturist from within the UT. "No land used for agricul-

Student In Ranikhet Tests Positive As Schools Reopen In Uttarakhand

Ranikhet: An 18-year-old student tested positive for COVID-19 at Ranikhet in Uttarakhand's Almora district on Monday as most schools reopened across the state after remaining closed for eight months due to the pandemic.

A student of class 12 has tested positive at a school in Ranikhet. Over a dozen students who had come in contact with him have been put under isolation and the school has been sealed for three days, district administration sources said.

While the infected student is under treatment, the samples of students currently under isolation have been sent for testing and their reports are awaited, they said.

Schools in Uttarakhand reopened for classes 10 and 12 on Mon-



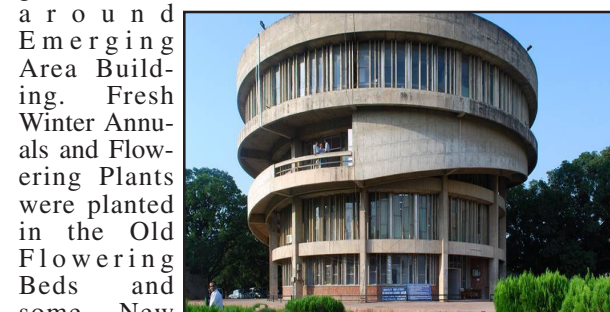
day to thin attendance from students amid strict observance of COVID guidelines like wearing of masks and maintaining social distancing.

Though most

schools reopened as ordered by the state government, parents were averse to sending their children to the institutes amid rising cases of the infection. —PTI

U'khand's Covid Recovery Rate Nears 92%, 316 New Cases

Dehradun (The Hawk): Uttarakhand's COVID-19 caseload rose to 63,197 on Tuesday as 316 fresh infections were detected, the Health Bulletin issued by the Directorate of Medical Health & Family Welfare, Uttarakhand Government said. As of today, the tally comprises of 57,951 cured and recovered patients while the number of active cases in the state stands at 3,705. The state's toll rose to 1033 as four succumbed to the SARS-CoV-2 infection during the last 24 hours, whereas the number of those migrated out of State is

508. Total number of patients treated and cured today was 409. The percentage of recovery for Covid-19 patients in the State has marginally gone up to 91.70 percent. District Dehradun again reported the maximum number of 74 fresh cases, whereas U S Nagar, Pauri Garhwal, Nainital, Haridwar, Almora and Pithoragarh followed with 59, 43, 29, 21, 19 and 19 cases respectively. That apart 14 cases were detected in Tehri Garhwal, 13 Chamoli, 12 Uttarkashi, 7 Rudraprayag and 3 each in Bageshwar and Champawat.
