

SC Terms As Academic Pleas Of 9 Disqualified MLAs Of Uttarakhand



New Delhi: The Supreme Court today termed as "academic" the appeals of then nine rebel Congress MLAs of Uttarakhand challenging the Nainital High Court order that had upheld their disqualification by the Speaker of the assembly.

A bench comprising Chief Justice Dipak Misra and justices A M Khanwilkar and D Y Chandrachud disposed of the pleas of MLAs, saying that a new assembly has come into being now.

The top court, however, made clear that it would hear the appeal of the Centre against the High Court verdict holding as "unconstitutional" the imposition of the

President rule in the hill state by sacking the then Congress government.

"In our considered opinion the Special Leave Petitions (of MLAs) have become academic in nature and the new legislature assembly has come into being," the bench said.

It further said that the individual grievances of then disqualified MLAs do not survive.

The court posted the matter for further hearing after 12 weeks.

The apex court had in September last year refused to stay the disqualification of then nine rebel Congress MLAs in the Uttarakhand, including states former Chief Min-

ister Vijay Bahuguna.

It had also refused to discuss the constitutionality of the decision taken by then Speaker Govind Singh Kunjwal to disqualify the nine MLAs when a motion for his own removal was pending in the House.

The rebels, who have now joined the BJP, had based their petition against the Speaker's disqualification on the recent Constitution Bench judgement in the Arunachal Pradesh case.

A five-judge bench had held that a Speaker, facing motion for removal, cannot disqualify lawmakers who are part of the motion.

The Centre had dismissed the then Congress government and imposed President's rule after nine Congress MLAs sided with the BJP on the Appropriation Bill.

The rebel MLAs were subsequently disqualified by the speaker under the anti-defection law, a decision that was upheld by the high court.

The apex court-mandated floor test had led to revival of the Harish Rawat government in the state. PTI

Niti Ayog Structure Its Schemes As Per States Circumstances: Rawat

Dehradun: Uttarakhand Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat today made a strong pitch for the Niti Ayaog structuring its schemes as per the states circumstances and asked it to include a provision for building ropeways to boost connectivity in hill villages under the PMGSY.

Making his point at a meeting with Niti Ayog vice chairman Rajiv Kumar at his residence here, he said schemes should be conceived as per the unique circumstances of states.

Rawat expressed the state governments intentions to give a boost to tourism, organic farming and horticulture based-activities and added that building of ropeways should be brought under the scope of the Pradhan Mantri Gram Sadak Yojana (PMGSY) to strengthen connectivity in hill villages, an official release said.

It would help save the hills from the damaging effects of road building, he said.

Kumar said there should be a direct communication between the Aayog and the state government

and his visit to the chief minister was meant to know the priorities of his government.

Niti Aayog would also take steps if the state government needed any

assistance from the central government in the implementation of a scheme, he said. Secretary (Planning) Amit Negi gave a brief presentation on behalf of the state government

which sought expert advisory services from the Aayog for the unification of departments, solid waste management, developing new tourist spots, creation of homestay fa-

cilities for visitors, industrial policy for the hills and construction of ropeways. The state government also demanded a green bonus for Uttarakhand. PTI

Snowfall Likely In High Reaches In HP: Met

Shimla: The India Meteorological Department forecast rain and snowfall in few places in next 24 hours as it was partly cloudy and mainly dry in the state on Tuesday.

This capital town was the coldest place on Monday night as mercury stayed two degrees below normal. Shimla Met Office said that the western disturbances is heading toward this hill state and the high reaches were cloudy and likely to have snowfall by this evening. The dark clouds were hovering over the 13,050 ft high Rohtang Pass on Tuesday.

Locals said that no snowfall occurred till this afternoon. The valley is still open for vehicular traffic, and vehicles plied through the day.

There is no report of rain or snowfall from any other part of state, however, it was chilly during the day with the entry of western disturbances in the state.

The capital town recorded fall of three degrees in the night temperature, recording a low at six degrees Celsius, two degrees below normal.

Mercury also plunged in mid

hills, however, the high reaches is till warm. Keylong in Lahaul Spiti and Kalpa in Kinnaur recorded a low at 1.4 degrees C. Tourist resort Manali was low at 2.4 degrees, Bhuntar in Kullu district was 5.5 degrees, Dalhousie in Chamba 6.2 degrees, Solan, Sundernagar and Chamba was at 6.6 degrees, Mandi seven degrees, Una 8.4 degrees and Palampur in Kangra 8.5 degrees, Bilaspur nine degrees, Dharmshala and Kangra 9.8 degrees and Hamirpur nearly 10 degrees C.

परिजनों ने सिडकुल चौकी पर प्रदर्शन कर फैक्ट्री प्रबंधन एवं श्रमिक ठेकेदार के खिलाफ कार्रवाई करने और 10लाख रूपए मुआवाजा, परिवार के एक सदस्य को नौकरी की मांग को लेकर हंगामा किया। चौकी प्रभारी के आश्वासन पर लोग शांत हुए। जानकारी के अनुसार मूलरूप से ग्राम समूहों तहसील नबाबगंज बरेली निवासी 36 वर्षीय नथूलाल पुत्र केवलराम करीब 10 वर्ष पूर्व कृष्णा कालोनी टाजिट कंपनी आया था और यहीं मकान बनाकर परिवार सहित रहने लगा। नथूलाल सिडकुल स्थित टाटा वेंडर फैक्ट्री में ठेकेदार के अधीन काम करता था। परिजनों ने बताया कि गत 11 नवम्बर को दोपहर नथूलाल कार्य के दौरान अचानक मूर्च्छित होकर गिर पड़ा जिस पर उन्हें उपचार के लिए नगर के एक निजी चिकित्सालय ले जाया गया जहां चिकित्सकों ने उन्हें मृत घोषित कर दिया था।

हंगामा कर गंभीर रूप से घायल कर दिया। दोनों को उपचार के लिए जिला चिकित्सालय ले जाया गया जहां उनकी हालत चिंताजनक देखते हुए चिकित्सकों ने उन्हें रेफर कर दिया। मूलरूप से ग्राम पहाड़पुरा बिलासपुर रामपुर निवासी कुलदीप सिंह पुत्र सुच्चा सिंह व मनप्रीत सिंह पुत्र गुरदीप सिंह ग्राम भमरौला में किरायेदार के रूप में रहते हैं और छतरपुर रोड स्थित अशोक लेलेण्डउ पफैक्ट्री में काम करते हैं। बताया जाता है कि आज प्रातः उक्त दोनों युवक जब फैक्ट्री गेट पर पहुंचे तो वहां उनका गाड़ी पार्किंग करने को लेकर कुछ लोगों से विवाद हो गया।
