

Salary Contribution By Uttarakhand MLAs To Fight COVID-19 Made Mandatory



Dehradun: The Uttarakhand government has brought an ordinance making it compulsory for all members of the state assembly to contribute 30 per cent of their salary and allowances towards the battle against the coronavirus pandemic. The ordinance was brought at a meeting of the state cabinet chaired by Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat on Thursday.

"According to the ordinance every MLA will have to contribute 30 per cent of his salary and perks towards the fight against the Corona crisis with effect from April 2020 to March 2021," state government spokesman and cabinet minister Madan Kaushik told reporters after the meeting. A 30 per cent cut will be imposed on the salary, constituency and secretarial allowances of all legislators for one year, he said. The meeting also decided to hold a three-day session of the state assembly in Dehradun from Sept 23-25. PTI

U'khand To Adopt NALSA Norms For Compensation To Victims Of Sexual And Other Crimes

Dehradun: The Uttarakhand government on Thursday decided to adopt the National Legal Services Authority guidelines for the payment of compensation to survivors of sexual and other offences against women.

The government also approved a proposal to hold a three-day session of the Uttarakhand assembly in Dehradun from Sept 23 to Sept 25, government spokesman Madan Kaushik told reporters.

The decisions were taken in a Cabinet meeting chaired by Chief Minister Trivendra Singh Rawat, he said. The Cabinet gave its nod to a compensation scheme based on the NALSA guidelines meant for the victims of

sexual and other crimes against women, he added. Under the scheme, lakh to 8 lakh, said Kaushik. The Cabinet also

Punjab CM Takes Students On Tour Of His Office



Chandigarh: Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh took a group of students, whom he had met here at the launch of the smartphone scheme two days ago, on a tour of his office at the secretariat.

He said it was heartening to see the students' enthusiasm and positivity.

"I was happy to take the young students whom I had met on #Captain SmartConnect launch event, on a tour of my Secretariat office (on Wednesday) to give them a glimpse of administration working," Singh said in a tweet on Friday.

He also posted a video of the interaction with the students. State Congress president Samir Jakhar and senior government officials accompanied Singh in his office tour.

The students had requested the chief minister to show them his office after the launch of the Punjab Smart Connect Scheme.

Singh in the video is seen giving the students an extensive tour of the secretariat, including the room where meetings are held.

The chief minister, who has also served in the Indian Army, guided a student who shared his interest to join the defence forces.

"If anyone of you is interested to join politics, then he/she can sit over there," Singh said while pointing to his chair in the office.

Singh on Wednesday launched the "Punjab Smart Connect Scheme" through video conferencing here on the occasion of Jannashtami and International Youth Day. He handed over smartphones to six Class 12 students. The scheme will benefit a total of 1,74,015 Class 12 students of government schools in the first phase, which will be completed by November.

Giving free smartphones to youths of the state was one of the key poll promises of the Congress during the 2017 assembly elections. PTI

Music Industry Hit Hard By Coronavirus In Haldwani

Haldwani (Uttarakhand): Scores of musicians and singers in Haldwani city of Uttarakhand have been hit by COVID-19 pandemic as public gatherings have been banned and people are not willing to step outdoors to attend concerts and shows.



These musicians are now putting their videos on social media platforms to showcase their talent and earn the livelihood. In turn, people around the world have turned to music to help them through the crisis.

"Earlier, I use to do live shows here. But after the lockdown, the scenario has changed. We are now buying studio equipment to do recording at our homes and putting the videos on social

media platforms," said Dhruv, a singer.

"Musicians are now buying instruments and other studio equipment from our shop. No shows are happening in the city because of COVID," said KK Bhatt, studio designer, Haldwani.

According to the Union Health Ministry, there are a total of 4,059 active cases of COVID-19. Out of the total, 6,687 have been migrated/cured and 140 have died after contracting the infection. —ANI

Uttarakhand: Kumaon Commissioner Visits Rain-Hit Areas In Dharchula

Dehradun: After heavy rains caused multiple landslides and raised water levels of rivers in many parts of Uttarakhand, Kumaon Commissioner Arvind Singh Hyanki visited rain-hit areas and took stock of the situation in Dharchula on Thursday.

Hyanki, along with other senior officials from all concerned departments, met people of Dharchula at the block auditorium, listened to their grievances and promised that relief will be provided to them on priority.



"The relief package has been provided to the people whose houses are completely damaged and will be provided to anyone who is left behind. We have also arranged for shelters for natural disaster victims, and are ready to provide all the help needed for their rehabilitation," said the Commissioner. He added that

Punjab CM Bans Sale Of 9 Agrochemicals To Protect Paddy Crop Quality



Chandigarh: Punjab Chief Minister Amarinder Singh on Friday ordered a ban on the sale and use of nine agro-chemicals after the Agriculture Department found these pesticides were still being used by farmers despite being detrimental to the quality of paddy. The ban is aimed at protecting the paddy's quality, which is critical for its export and remunerative pricing in the international market, an official statement said.

"The Chief Minister, who also holds the Agriculture portfolio, has ordered the ban on Acephate, Triazophos, Thiamethoxam, Carbendazim, Tricyclazole, Buprofezin, Carbofuran, Propiconazole and Thiophanate Methyl, under section 27 of the Insecticides Act, 1968 with immediate effect," the statement said. Under the ban orders, the sale, stocking, distribution and use of these nine insecticides on rice crops has been prohibited. The chief minister has asked Agriculture Secretary K S Pannu to issue detailed guidelines to ensure strict enforcement of the ban. PTI

Punjab Releases Social Security Pensions Worth Rs 189.34 Cr For 25.25 Lakh Beneficiaries

Chandigarh (Punjab): The Punjab government has released a sum of Rs 189.34 crores into the accounts of social security pensions and other financial assistance schemes to the beneficiaries for the month of July, a spokesperson said on Friday.

According to the spokesperson, the state's Finance Department releases the sum on the directives of Punjab Chief Minister Captain Amarinder Singh.

"The said amount would be soon credited through Direct Benefit Transfer (DBT) to 25.25 lakh beneficiaries including elderly, widow and destitute women, dependent children and disabled persons," the spokesperson said.
